Dallas BA Makes Members' Voices Heard in Washington

On June 15, members and government relations staff of the Dallas BA traveled to Washington, D.C. to speak with our service area's congressional delegation about the regulatory and economic challenges the home building industry is currently facing. With interest rates climbing that very day, as well as ongoing shortages in needed building materials, costly tariffs on lumber and a shortfall in eligible workforce, the meetings on the Hill were timely.

The underlying need to address, that Dallas BA and other HBA's from around the country raised to Congress on June 15, is housing affordability, or even just attainability. The shortage of housing that American families can afford to purchase has become a growing problem that can hinder the economic expansion provided by home building. The Association explained to our congressional delegation how home construction and related services account for more than 15% of the nation's Gross Domestic Product, resulting in millions of jobs, both in construction and in businesses related to home building. With home prices seeing their biggest increase in the history of the National Home Price index in 2021, and mortgage interest rates increasing, Dallas BA explained how the aforementioned benefits are at risk.

The impact of material delays and costs on home prices was a key topic in the meetings. With price spikes in lumber packages adding thousands to the price of single-family and multifamily homes since last August, Dallas BA voiced the need for Congress to urge the White House to suspend tariffs on Canadian lumber imports and enter back into negotiations with Canada for an effective softwood lumber agreement. We also urged support for the No Timber from Tyrants Act, legislation that would ban lumber imports from Russia and resume a more appropriate level of harvesting of timber from U.S. federal lands, while creating jobs and helping manage against forest disasters.

Prior to the meetings, Dallas BA sent policy information that included the request to pass the Ocean Shipping reform Act. The U.S. House passed the bill early in the week of our visits. The legislation, quickly signed into law on June 16, aims to help solve port congestion and shipping challenges, mainly via transparency initiatives.

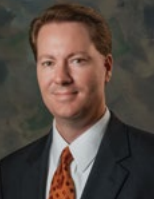
Association members and staff also described the impact increased fuel prices are having on business. Congressional offices were also asked to promote

and fund job training programs.

With safety and health protocols presenting additional hurdles to entry, as well as the effort and dedication to attend the congressional and NAHB leadership meetings, we can't say enough about how much we appreciate the participation of our members.

In Dallas, the advocacy effort for efficiency in city permitting processes continues. At the end of May, Dallas BA members and staff met with the new Chief Building Official for the City of Dallas, Andres Espinoza. The meeting also involved his assistant directors for residential permitting and land development. The director gave an overview of his plans to address the challenges that have plagued that department. In their effort to address delays, the department established a specific email address for escalated requests and faster resolution of projects that are held up. The email, BuildingOfficial@DallasCityHall.com routes directly to the Chief and Deputy Chief Building Officials. Customers are to receive responses in 24-48 hours. Members facing delays are encouraged to make use of that email and copy Phil.

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Efforts to oust Dallas city manager fizzles

Facing a council divided over whether City Manager T.C. Broadnax would continue in his role and days after declaring that he would vote to fire him, Dallas Mayor Eric Johnson and Broadnax released a joint statement on the path forward. Just days after declaring it was time for a change, Mayor Johnson expressed his belief that Broadnax is ready to make necessary changes and that “now is the time for a reset with real results and accountability.”

Broadnax, in turn, acknowledged that he needed to handle some issues better. “I know my team and I can be better. I understand that I am fully accountable to my 15 bosses. So today, I want to say to the mayor, to the members of the City Council, and to all the residents of this dynamic city: I accept the challenge,” Broadnax said. “I take full responsibility for addressing the issues that are critical to the long-term success of the City. I recognize that our problems are not just about what the media reports, but how we perform. I own that.”

Permitting was the number one issue on the list of priorities for improvement even above public safety. After two years of crippling delays, the statement calls for the city manager to, “develop a clear action plan for fixing the city’s development services backlogs and delays on an expedited timeline. The plan will incorporate feedback from builders and

developers and focus on improving the customer experience. It will also focus on both short-term triage and systemic change that will ensure smoother operations in the future.”

“Whether it gets fixed because the city manager has turned over a new leaf and is now empathetic toward what we have been through or he simply needs to get it right because his job depends on it doesn’t matter to me,” said Dallas BA Executive Officer, Phil Crone. “Last month we were told it should be perfect in nine months, but the reality is we still have a long way to go just to be average.”

On June 14, the Association, [in a letter signed by Crone](#), called for a dignified yet decisive transition at the city manager position. The letter cited hundreds of jobs lost due to the permitting crisis and tens of thousands of families left unable to find housing in Dallas.

“I’m encouraged that permitting was the number one issue cited in their joint statement,” said Crone. “Whether it gets fixed or not is a very objective measure, so success or lack thereof will be very clear to see. I know our members understand we are doing everything we can to get this back on track. If the city manager demonstrates even a small fraction of that desire, we will happily work with him to get where we need to go.”
